January, FRIDAY 1. 1892.

Praise God from whom all blessings flows. This is a beautiful day. every body seems to look happy today. I have called on Mr and Mrs. Brock and Mr. and Mrs. Anderson. I have did nothing much today so far. This morning while front I saw J.E.H. the first time in a great while. I received no money today, but I have very good health thank God and that is so much better than money. This evening I was at Church, this being the twenty-ninth anniversary of emancipation proclamation was celebrated tonight at the Chapel. Mr. Isaiah C. Wear and Mr. A. K. McClure were the speakers. There was agrat many out and every thing went off nicely. Went to bed at 12 Oclock. I was at Sister Butlers after lunch.

January, SATURDAY 2. 1892.

Late getting up today. raining quite hard, has rained off and on since midnight. At market. Mr. Haseltine is going out for dinner tonight and I have just been to take a note for him. and out I stoped and Mrs. Andersons and there met Mrs. Woodland. She seemed to be some what provoked about something with me. I have paid for the recorder for two years this afternoon. I was to see DeCato this evening and He told me that Hale had gone home and that he was going South in ten days from now. While I was at DeCato a man came in to see him and they both acted quite funny indeed. DeCato left me in the back room and went out with his friend into the next. 11 Oclock.

January, SUNDAY 3. 1892.

up early and at prayer meeting. Brother Washington was to have open this morning but he was late getting up, so I had to open myself. We had avery good meeting. A Mr. Johnson preached this morning from West Chester at 10.45 He spoke quite well. I remained for the class this morning, and lead it. This afternoon I went to Bro Butlers first then down to Cousin James Washington from there to Mrs. Andersons, and from Mrs. Andersons to Mrs. Kings. I was at Church again tonight but not many out. after Church I went around to bro Butler's awhile before coming in. It is quite cold tonight. I am going to bed very early. 10.30 Oclock

January, MONDAY 4. 1892.

Late getting up this morning. After breakfast today I cleaned silver for four hours. Have not been out any where today yet. This evening before going to church I called at the Andersons awhile. I then stoped in to prayer meeting and paid over my class money to brother Brock. I had \$6.00. It has snowed alittle this evening for the first time this season.

Went to bed at 11.45 Oclock

January, TUESDAY 5. 1892.

Not so cold as yesterday. I had aletter from J.E.H. this morning and am glad to know he is better and able to write again. I swept and cleaned the dining room today also the pantry. I have just written aletter to my Sister Martha. This evening I was at Church we had avery good meeting quite a lot out. Mr. Tailer spoke. I think he talked rather long.

There has not been much for me to write about today.

Went to bed at 11 Oclock.

January, WEDNESDAY 6. 1892.

It is snowing this morning. I cleaned off the snow front before going to Market so when I came in I only had the yard to do. This afternoon I went down to see Mrs. Sadie Brown who is quite ill in bed and has been for the last week past. I talked with her for some time and then I prayed with, and for her. This evening I was at church. We had agood meeting quite anumber out concitering the weather. Mr. Taylor preached. I like him better then I did a first. Some how I have not entered into the spirit of this meeting as I should like to, but I am trying hard to do so.

Rather late getting in tonight. Went to bed at 11.30 Oclock Lulu Handy my sister was Married today, I hear.

January, THURSDAY 7. 1892.

This is a beautiful morning quite cold but very bright. I was out for alittle while this forenoon and had then intended to go out again this afternoon, but Kate had to go down

to her Brother's so I could not make it to get out again. I am now disappointed in going out this evening also. Kate is going out again with Mary Brown so I will not get to church.

Went to bed at 11.45 O'clock.

January, FRIDAY 8. 1892.

very cold this morning. I have been out awhile. I taken the tacks out of the carpet in Mr. Haseltine's room. This afternoon I written two letters and did some reading. This evening I was at church Brother Brock spoke afterwards we engaged into a prayer meeting for a short time not many out. I heard that Mrs. Sadie Brown is better tonight. Went to bed at 11.45 O'clock

January, SATURDAY 9. 1892.

quite late getting up this morning The day is a very fine. after breakfast I went to market, and after market, I went to Mr. Haseltine's room and got it ready for the men to put down the carpet. I remained there in the room with them all the while. This afternoon I went to pay some bills for Mr. Haseltine. This evening I called at the Anderson's and there learned to my great surprise that Mrs. Sadie Brown had passed away this morning. I am so glad that I was to see her on Wednesday last, little I then thought that that would be the last time I would see her alive. Little Carrie Brice is very ill. I was to see her also this evening and heard she was much better. I am getting very sleepy

January, SUNDAY 10. 1892.

up early and at prayer meeting Bro Butler had this morning not many out but a good meeting. At 10.45 Bro Brock preached a beautiful sermon and administered the Sacrament and baptized a child. This afternoon I went to Bro Butler's and he and I first went to 15th and Lombard Sts church. the church was full so we could not get in so we went on to Mr. Brown's his wife being dead. From there we went to see little Carrie Brice who is very ill. Then I went around home with Bro B—and had some dinner with him and family. and this evening the Rev Mr. Taylor preached a good sermon. we did not have any prayer meeting this evening. Went to bed at 10.45 O'clock.

January, MONDAY 11. 1892.

It has snowed a little today and is quite cold. So far nothing to write about except that I have received a letter from J.E.H. I went down to Mrs. A. Butler's awhile today.

At Church this evening not any one out much Brother Smith spoke.

January, TUESDAY 12. 1892.

It is looking like rain. I am going to Mrs. Sadie Brown's funeral today at two o'clock. It is to take place at Allen Chapel. This morning I saw J.E.H. from the old look out and they were very charming. Well I have been to the funeral and it was very well attended. I afterwards went down to the Anderson's for quite awhile I met Mrs. Davenger Mrs. Woodland and Mrs. Bree and they all got at me about not marrying. but I think that I held my own with them all. At church this evening Bro Brock spoke and we had a very good meeting I came home at 10.15 and went to bed at 11 O'clock.

January, WEDNESDAY 13. 1892.

It is raining very hard and has rained off and on all night. At market. and have did nothing much since. This evening I attended prayer meeting at Allen Chapel. Some Mr. Henry spoke. He talked very well indeed. We had one person up for prayer. a young man. I walked out home with Miss Price. I then came in and went to bed at 10.45 O'clock.

January, THURSDAY 14. 1892.

It is raining still quite hard this morning. I went out to take a note for Mr. Haseltine today and I walked down Chestnut St. and saw lots of pretty things. When I came in again I cleaned my silver.

This evening I was at prayer meeting again there was a large number at it. a very good meeting. Bro Brock was very late in coming tonight. We had no one up for prayer tonight. Dr. Lee I hear is very anxious for me to join the Y.M.C.A. but I don't know what to do about it just yet. There is not much going on to write. So I shall go to bed at once. 11.45 O'clock.

January, FRIDAY 15. 1892.

We have quite a Snow this morning and it is still snowing now. I have been working in snow and ashes all day. Mr. Haseltine is going out to dinner this evening so I shall go out early too and have my hair cut before church time. When I went to the barber shop I found Mr. Fry the man that always does my work was at home sick, and had been for three weeks so the young man that did my cutting did it very well. After leaving the shop I called at Mrs. Cummings to see her Mother who is sick in bed I sat with her for awhile before going to Church and it made me late for church. We had one convert in our meeting tonight. I Walked up the St with Bro Orrick. Went to bed at 12 O'clock.

January, SATURDAY 16. 1892.

This is a beautiful morning Clear and cold. At market was late getting in again. Have done nothing much since. Today I bought myself a tooth brush. And this is the very first thing I have gotten for myself this year. This evening I called at the Anderson's but there were no one home except the children so I only stayed for a little while and then walked down Walnut St and met a young man I had been thinking about all day. but he did not come in with me as he said he was going to do. I saw Mr. D. J. Bullock and talked with him for some time tonight and 19th and Samson Sts.

Went to bed at 11.15 O'clock.

January, SUNDAY 17. 1892.

This is a beautiful morning and just to think I did not go to prayer meeting. I am now quite ashamed of myself for it. The Rev. J. W. Beckett preached all day. We had a full church and good sermon. Mr. Woodson went up for prayer this morning. This afternoon I attended Sunday School. We had a large number out. From there I went to Mrs. Anderson's and stayed until it was time to come in for supper. I was at church again this evening Bro Beckett spoke again and then was prayer meeting afterwards and Mr. Woodson was the only one that went up to be prayed for. I heard this after noon that Mrs. Woodson is sick. This has been a glorious day to me and do thank God so much for it. Went to bed at 10.30 O'clock.

January, MONDAY 18. 1892.

It is raining this morning. I have cleaned silver today did not go out as I had intended to this morning at first. At church this evening quite a good many out and a very good

meeting. We had no one forward for prayer. Afterwards I went home with Bro Butler for awhile.

Went to bed at 11.15 O'clock.

January, TUESDAY 19. 1892.

It is still raining today. I have cleaned the dining room and closets today. Then I went to take a note for Mr. Haseltine and stopped at the Anderson's on my way back. I also met Dr. Beckett in the Street. I saw Miss Stoney at Mrs. Anderson's. Heard that Mrs. S. Woodland is quite unwell today. This evening on my way to church I called by Mrs. Burke's to see how she was and found her no better I am sorry to say. The meeting at church tonight was a very good one indeed. We had one convert and two others down. The convert was Brother Woodson. We were all glad to see him get up and confess the lord.

Went to bed at 11.45 O'clock.

January, WEDNESDAY 20. 1892.

It has snowed in the night and is very cold this morning. I have been working with snow all morning. I have wanted to go down to Mrs. Woodson all day but it seems that I am not going to make it. at church this evening and Dr. Handy of Washington spoke we had a full house. there were three persons up for prayer and one of them came through.

I walked home with Sister Logan from church.

Went to bed at 11 O'clock.

I written a letter to J. this afternoon.

January, THURSDAY 21. 1892.

very cold this morning but clear. I have taken up the ashes today. this afternoon I taken a bath, then I went to see Mrs. Woodson and found her much better than I expected to find her from what I had heard. I also went to Chapel to the afternoon prayer meeting but there was not any I then went to Mrs. Andersons for awhile. This evening I was at church for only short time as Mr. Haseltine was not feeling very well. However I went to

back to church later and then went home with Bro Butlers and stayed for the night. They were having a good time at the church when I got back there.

Went to bed at 12 O'clock.

January, FRIDAY 22. 1892.

It is looking like rain. Mr. Haseltine is going to have some friends to dinner today so I shall not be able to get to meeting this evening. I am quite sorry for it as this is Mr. Beckett's last night with us. 10 O'clock P.M. I have gotten through with dinner and am going to church for a while. Annie Leonard came through tonight. She was a very bright convert indeed.

I went to bed at 12 O'clock.

January, SATURDAY 23. 1892.

Late getting up fine day. at market. Nothing much doing today. This evening I called at Sister Butler's and had a nice talk with her. I then came in early and went to bed. I am going to prayer meeting in the morning if I live.

January, SUNDAY 24. 1892.

I was up early at prayer meeting. Bro Brock open the meeting and there were two persons forward for prayers. The meeting was very good in every way. I snowed at 10 O'clock today. Rev Dr Smith of Atlantce City preached at 10.45. large number out to hear him. We had union meeting this afternoon with Brothers Offley's and Redick's churches. It was perfectly grand there were four different speakers and they all spoke very well. I called to see Sister Burreall and Bro. Swell this afternoon. They have both been very ill and are still in bed. I went to Bro Butlers and taken dinner with him and family. At church this evening again and Dr. Smith preached again to a crowded house. prayer meeting afterwards one convert. I went to bed at 10.30 O'clock.

January, MONDAY 25. 1892.

Avery fine day. I have been doing nothing much I had intended to go out to call on some friends today but I did not do so. I streaghten up the celler, and did alittle writting. Mr. Haseltine is out to lunch today. Mrs. Quinn has been out all morning. This evening I went to church. Dr Heard spoke Matt 3 Chaper 2 ver. There were quite alarge number out and three persons up for prayer. and one convert. Annie Pipes came through tonight. She has had a hard time of it.

I went to bed at 11.15 Oclock.

P.S. I had aletter from J H. this morning and I shall not see him this evening. I am not sorry for it though.

January, TUESDAY 26. 1892.

This is a very cold day. I went over at Mrs. Jaynes. Kettie is going away on Thursday to be married I am going to get her something so she can remember me by. This afternoon I was at the Anderson's for awhile and had quite atalk with Mrs. Rev Mr. Palmer spoke this evening for us. There were three persons up for prayer but no conversions. I went to bed at 10.50 Oclock.

January, WEDNESDAY 27. 1892.

Late getting up this morning. It is still very cold today. I have cleaned silver. After doing my marketing today I went to Callwell and bought some spoons for Kettie McLean and think them quite purtty. This afternoon I wrote a letter to J. This evening at church Rev Dr Coppin spoke. There were three persons up for prayer and one of them came through before I left. I walked home with Miss Prise. Went to bed at 10.30 Oclock.

January, THURSDAY 28. 1892.

It is warmer this morning I swept and cleaned the breakfast room today. This evening at church. We had agood meeting Rev Mr Henry spoke. There were 6 persons up for prayer and there were two of them come through. After church I went home with Mr and Mrs Anderson and stayed until 12 Oclock.

P.S. This afternoon I went over to Mrs. Jaynes and bid Kettie good by.

January, FRIDAY 29. 1892.

It is still warm. I have did nothing much today. This afternoon I went to see Davenger but he was out so I then hoped that I would see him at church this evening but he did not come out. The meeting was very good. there were two converts. We all stayed in Church very late. Went to bed at 11.45 O'clock.

January, SATURDAY 30. 1892.

Not so cold today. I have been to market. Nothing seems to be going right with me today some how. This evening I went to Mrs Anderson's and there I met Mr. Hardie and had quite a talk with him about things in genearl. came in and went to bed at 11 OClock.

January, SUNDAY 31. 1892.

Up at 5.30 at church at 6. I open the meeting many out but we had a enteresting meeting. bro Brock did not come in at all this morning. At 10.45 I went to church again. Bro Brock spoke to agood large number and there were 6 persons who joined afterwards. This afternoon I was to see the sick. I went first to see Mrs. Teriby [?] and then I went up town to see Mrs. Carney. she has been and still is very ill. I read and prayed with before leaving. I then went to see Annie Cole my nies. from there I can home. I found Kate quite up in arms about some thing that had been said in next door about herself and Catherin. I with very late getting to church this evening. There were two up for prayer. I went to bed at 11 Oclock.

February, MONDAY 1. 1892.

This is a gray morning. I did not go out any where this forenoon for I have been expecting the woodman all day but he has not come as yet. Mr. Hasetine paid me my wagers today. I had a letter from J. saying that he would see me on the 8th of this month. I have written aletter to Davenger today asking him for some money that he is owing me. This evening I was at church but the meeting seemed cold. The trustees had ameeting and I attended it. Went to bed at 11.45 Oclock

February, TUESDAY 2. 1892.

It is damp and cold this morning. I have washed of front today, and yard also. This afternoon I went for the man to come in the morning and take away the ashes from the range. H.B. Davenger sent me a letter this afternoon, saying if I would call at his house this evening he would pay me \$15.00 of the money he is owing me. I shall be sure and call. My woodman has not turned up yet. This evening I did not go to church as I had to go down to Davenger's. H paid me \$15.00 of the money that he is owing me tonight. So I stayed and talked to Mr. and Mrs. Davenger the rest of the evening. I went to bed at 11.30 O'clock.

February, WEDNESDAY 3. 1892.

I was up early this morning and got ready for the ashmen who came at 7 o'clock. Before going to market today I had to go down town for Mr. Haseltine and while I was out the woodman came and left the wood. I have swept and cleaned dining room. I met Mr. Flood coming to see me. He wanted to get some money from me, but I haven't any to lend now. This afternoon I went to see Mrs. Gray who is ill in bed, and when I left I gave her one dollar. She is a very poor woman with three children to care for and no one to help. I called at the Anderson's. Mr. is [] sick again. at church this evening. Dr Lee spoke no one up for prayer. I paid J.V. Simpson \$20.00. the money that J.M. Rathel was owing him when he died. I promise Dr Lee that I would join the Y.M.C.A. on Sunday next. I went home with Miss Price tonight.

February, THURSDAY 4. 1892.

Late getting up this morning. it is looking very much like snow today. I have cleaned silver again today. It seems that I am always at silver any more. I went for the Dr. for Mr. Haseltine this morning. He is not very well. On yesterday I written a letter to Mrs. Harrodd. I saw J.E.H. this morning from the old look-out.

This evening before going to church I called at the Anderson's Mr. is not at all well. Mrs. and myself walked to church together. Mr. Emry spoke. there were not out many to hear him.

February, FRIDAY 5. 1892.

Mr. Haseltine is not much better today. The Dr has been to see him. he to have some friends here to dinner this evening. so I shall not get to church tonight. The diner went

off nicely. Bro Orrick was to see me today and wants me to help him with the Turner reception but I shall do but a very little as I am short of money just now. I have had nothing much to write about today of any interest.

February, SATURDAY 6. 1892.

Late getting up this morning. It is quite cold but clear and bright at market. This has been a very funny day to me I have done nothing I had intended to do today. This afternoon I taken some cards for Mr Haseltine over to Spruce St. I then called at the Anderson's before coming in. We did not have dinner until seven o'clock this evening on the account of Mr. Cox coming in to see Mr. Haseltine. Mr. Haseltine is very much better today. This evening I went to see the Butlers and had a good time with them.

I went to at 11 O'clock.

February, SUNDAY 7. 1892.

I was very late getting up this morning so I was late getting to prayer meeting. Bro Butler open and the meeting was a very good There was one person up for prayer. At church at 11 O'clock and Bro Fisher spoke not many out. After preaching was over one person joined the church and came into my class. This afternoon I went down to the Y.M.C.A and enjoyed it very much. Mr. Haseltine is still better today. I was at the Butlers for dinner to-day. This evening at church Bro Brock spoke not many out. I went to bed at 11 O'clock.

I afterwards went home with bro Brock for a while and had a nice talk with him. This evening I attended love feacet at Chapel and it was very grand in every way.

Went to bed at 11 O'clock.

February, TUESDAY 9. 1892.

This is another very fine day. I have been to take a note down the Miss Fisher's. I bought a picture this morning at the door to make a present of to Mr. and Mrs. C.C. Butler. This afternoon I taken the picture to the Butler's and they all seemed well pleased with it. I have again written to my Sister Eliza today. This evening I called at the Anderson's on my way to church. Mr. Anderson is better and is to go to work to-morrow. There were not many out to the Christian endeavor meeting. I walked to 17th and Walnut Sts with Bro Cooper.

I went to bed at 11.10 O'clock.

February, WEDNESDAY 10. 1892.

It is still fine weather. This is a beautiful morning. I have cleaned the dining room today and did the marketing. This afternoon Damwood Jones came to see me. I saw Dr. Jayne this afternoon. I came near falling on the St and he laughed at me and said he expected that I would yet break my neck sometime. My morning's lesson was on love. At Class this evening but there was not many of my members out. I lead them that were and then helped Bro Fisher with his leading. I went to bed at 11 O'clock

February, THURSDAY 11. 1892.

I was up early today and Cleaned some silver before breakfast. I had to go to the market again today. This evening I met my class but few out, but the meeting was good. After class, I went home with Bro Butler for awhile. This is the evening of the great concert of all of the A.M.E. churches of the City. I did not go to it though. went to bed at 10.30 O'clock.

February, FRIDAY 12. 1892.

Late getting up today. I have been getting things ready for the dinner Mr. Haseltine is giving this evening. I have did nothing else. The Dr was in again today to see Mr. Haseltine. This afternoon I went down to see Mr. Orrick and to tell him that I could not get off this evening to help with the reception that is to be given to Bishop Turner at

Allen Chapel this evening. It is very cold tonight and I am not sorry that I am not going out. sometimes I think that I am growing old fast, because I care such a little about going any where except to church.

February, SATURDAY 13. 1892.

I did not get up early as I thought I would do last night when I went to bed. I was at market and down Chestnut St. This afternoon I went to see the Anderson's and to hear about the reception last night and how it came off. They say it was a very nice affair lots of people there, and plenty to eat for them all. I received letters today from Mother, and sister Eliza. They are both well they say. This evening I went to bro Butler's and helped him arrange his pictures. I had a nice time of it while there. I went to bed at 11 O'clock.

February, SUNDAY 14. 1892.

Up early and at prayer meeting I open this morning not many out but there was a very good meeting in every way. There was one person up for prayer. at church again at 10.30 Dr. Bryant preached a powerful Sermon from Ezekiel first Chapter tenth verse. This afternoon I was at Sunday school and enjoyed Mr. Richings, who address the school He is a white man but to our Race he is a true man and a lover. After I left school I went to Bainbridge Street M.E Church to the union meeting which was very good. from there I went to see Mr. and Mrs. L. King. Mr is not well. I stayed with them quite awhile. at church again this evening bro Brock spoke on the life and works of Bishop Allen. Went to at 10.30 o'clock.

February, MONDAY 15. 1892.

Late getting up this morning. This is a beautiful day not cold at all. I have been and taken my money out of the Investing Co of Phila. I have been afraid of it so, I thought it better to get out of it at once. This evening before going to church called at the Anderson's Mrs. is not so well. This evening was quarterly conference at our church tonight. all the reports were a very good and showed that the Church is progressing in every department. Mr Orrick and I came from the meeting to Locust St. together.

I went to bed at 11 O'clock.

February, TUESDAY 16. 1892.

This is another beautiful day. some what colder then yesterday though. I have been out and bought Shoes and a hat for myself and some Coffee for the house. There was some one here to see me while I was out, Kate said. This evening I went first to the Anderson's and then to see W. H. Harris who is sick. He is one of the members of my class but he has not been to class for two years nearly. Still now he is sick he expects me to look after him as though he had not been roming all this time. This is election day but I shall not vote. or rather did not vote.

I went to bed at 12 oclock.

February, WEDNESDAY 17. 1892

It is still very cold but clear and beautiful today. While I was at market this morning Mr. Brock came to see me and will come again at two oclock. I can do nothing at all today some how. Mrs. Quinn is out. Mr. Brock did come again and I saw him. He wanted the of \$25.00 twenty five dollars for 2 months I let him have it. I am very fon of him so it is easy for me to oblige him. at churc this evening to see the Richings show of the progressive South. I liked it very well indeed.

I went to bed at 12 Oclock.

February, THURSDAY 18. 1892.

I was to have gotten up early this morning but I did not I am growing worse about getting up every day any more. I have done nothing that I had intend doing today. This afternoon I was down the St and saw [H.]C Hale. I was very much surprice to see him here in Phila again. I think him agreat fool to have come back here. I did not go to church this evening but taken awlak down Walnut St and met ayoung man who I had met in April and taked with him for some time and am to him later. So he has come as he said he would do. I like him so much. He is certainly avery nice fellow We sat and chated until after 1 Oclock to each other and did enjoy ourselves in great stile. His name is John Veronin. I got to bed at 1.30 Oclock.

February, FRIDAY 19. 1892

I was very late getting up today. I am feeling very tired this morning after my last night's fun and I have been thinking of poor John off and on all day. I do hope though he is all right. I have done nothing today hardly besides cleaning the breakfast room. This evening I called on the Anderson's. Mr. and Mrs. Anderson's are both unwell. I thought to go to church when I went out first tonight, but I did not. I spent the evening with the Anderson's. Came in and went to bed early. 10.30 O'clock.

February, SATURDAY 20. 1892.

I was to have gotten up early this morning but did not do it so some of the things I had intended doing today will go undone and market but before going to market I went to Dr. Fishers for Mr. Haseltine he wanted the Dr to come to dinner with him today but the Dr was already engaged for dinner elsewhere. This afternoon I cleaned by room and had also to take out more notes for Mr. Haseltine. I shall not go out this evening After dinner I shaved and taken a bath and went to bed at 11.30 O'clock.

February, SUNDAY 21. 1892

up at 6.15 and went to prayer meeting John Gardener lead today only 10 persons out but a very good meeting. I heard that Mr. John Holland was in trouble. He has been working Wanamaker's. After I had breakfast I went to the village. arranged som things for Mrs. Jayne then when I came back I began house cleaning. This evening I written to Mrs. Jayne. I shall not sleep in my own room tonight as I have let Henry have my bed for his wife and children so I am now sleeping at the house.

June, TUESDAY 21. 1892.

It is still raining. We were very late getting up this morning. We have been cleaning in the second story today. This evening I went to the village for awhile did nt see any one that I knew. I have ordered a Cutunder for to-morrow afternoon, I am going to take the girls out for adrive. I went to see the boat come in tonight. There were quite alarge number of persons on her tonight. I was late going to bed.

June, WEDNESDAY 22. 1892.

Well, it is still at it. It has rained every day since I have been here. I have been cleaning windows all day. There is nothing to write about at all toay. This afternoon The girls and I taken alittle outing, in a cutunder . In the village again tonight and saw Miss Moore and another lady whoes name I cant think of now. I bought myself ascraf pin and saw a lot of pretty things in the Chines Store. I did not stay late in the village tonight.

June, THURSDAY 23. 1892.

This is the first nice day we have had since we have been in Bar Harbor. Nothing on hand today, or in oder but house cleaning. We have been in the third story all morning. I went to the village this evening with Henry Montague, was at the post office and got aletter for Lizzie Miller I written aletter to C.C. Butler tonight.

June, FRIDAY 24. 1892.

I am still very buisey with the house cleaning process. I have reached the seller at last and when I am through with it I shall hve finish all the rough work. I went to work this morning at 5 Oclock and worked until 8 this evening. I am feeling alittle tired now and shall go to my bed shortly.

I received aletter from Mrs. Jayne this morning and a Telegram from Mr. Jayne this afternoon.

June, SATURDAY 25. 1892.

It is raining again this morning. Well I have finished the seller. And the Piezza. So I am through at least with the house cleaning. This evening I went to the village and had afind time. Mr. Foster was very pleasant to me indeed. Also Henry montague. I it was quite late when I gotten in.

10.30 P.M. and it is still raining.

June, SUNDAY 26. 1892.

Well it is still raining I have been to church this morning. there were agreat many out for Bar Harbor. I was to have made some calls this afternoon but it has rained so hard all the while that I could not get out. This evening I was at church again.

June, MONDAY 27. 1892.

We are still having it rainey and cold. I do hope that we may have a change before the folks comes. We are getting things in pretty good shape at last about the house. I have been to the village this morning with Henry and when I came back I put the Lamps in oder and did I have did nothing else besides this afternoon. I feel all ready now for the folks and shall be glad when they get here. I did not go to the village this evening.

This afternoon Henry taken the girls and I for adrive. I did not enjoy it much as it was so very cold.

June, TUESDAY 28. 1892.

It is raining harder this morning than ever. Mr. James Bullock is coming this afternoon. The girls and I have been very busy all day. Mr. Bullock arrived at 5.45 looking as large and strong as ever. He and I had quite a long talk together this evening. The world seems to have suddenly changed to him. He is not the boy of last year, by any means. The rest of the family are to be with us tomorrow. I am tired and shall go to bed at once.

June, WEDNESDAY 29. 1892.

I was very late getting up this morning. Well after all I have done I find that I have as much as I can do to be ready for the family this afternoon. Mr. Bullock was up in good time so I got to work in pretty good time for all. Mr. and Mrs. Jayne came at 5.45 this afternoon and Maggie and Jesse also. Mrs. Jayne seems to be well pleased with the house for which I am quite glad. There is nothing to write about today for if I do not go to the village I can't see or hear much up here. Everything here is much the same. I have neglected writing so far to any of my friends. I am ashamed of it but will do so at once.

I am now getting in gear and hope this is going to be a very pleasant summer for me. Mrs. Jayne seems as well pleased this morning as she did last night with the appearance of things I have done today besides dining room work. None of the folks went today. Nothing to write. Going to bed.

July, FRIDAY 1. 1892

I was up early today. Somehow I am not feeling alright. I believe that I have the blues for some cause, and I am growing worse all the while. This has been a very dreary kind of day and makes one feel like fighting or doing some desperate thing. The girls are all laughing at me because I am blue. I have decided to do ~~some~~ a very odd thing today. I have got to know something for myself so there is to be a change soon in my life. I am very late going to bed.

July, SATURDAY 2. 1892.

This is a beautiful morning The finest we have had since we have been there this season I had lots to do today but got through with all by lunch time. This is James M. Bullock's birth day. He is 21 today. Mrs. Jayne is not very well. Mr. Jayne and Mr. Bullock were out driving all morning. It is raining quite hard this morning. We have so much rain this season. I taken a bath and was quite late getting to bed tonight.

July, SUNDAY 3. 1892.

It is cloudy and is looking like rain again today. I have been to church this morning heard a good sermon. when church was out it began to pour down rain. I went to get a cut under for Lizzie and myself to bring us home we both got wet though not with standing we were in the cut under. This afternoon I did not go any where but read my Bible the entire afternoon. Did not go to church this evening or do much of any thing else as I became very sleepy early in the evening and went to bed. I am keeping my promise so far very well and I trust in God I may unto the end.

July, MONDAY 4. 1892.

This is a beautiful morning a little cold. I did nothing much today in the way of work but I have done quite lot of writing have paid a great many debts off that I was owing. Mrs. Jane has been out driving today for the first. Mr. Bullock out this evening. I am to wait up for him. Mr. Bullock came in at about 11.30 O'clock.

I have Written 4 letters this evening.

July, TUESDAY 5. 1892.

Late getting up. Morning very fine. Nothing much doing. have sent my letters to the post by Mr. Bullock This afternoon I went to the village and while there I met a Mr. Allen from Philadelphia and was with with for quite some time I also saw the boat come in and quite a number of folks came on her this afternoon. All together I have enjoyed myself very much indeed.

July, WEDNESDAY 6. 1892.

This is a very fine morning. up early but have did nothing much today. This evening I went to the village with Henry Montageu but there was nothing going on there. So I came home and went to bed.

July, THURSDAY 7. 1892.

I was a little late getting this morning. This is another beautiful day. I have been doing odds and end round the house all day. Mrs. Jayne has been driving both morning and afternoon today. This evening I got a letter from Dr. Wilson and he says that he has not heard from me. I cant tell why as I wrote him a week ago. However I wrote him again tonight. and went down to the village late to post it. Tonight is as beautiful as the day has been. the moon is grand and bright and the night is cool. Went to bed at 11 O'clock.

July, FRIDAY 8. 1892.

The sun rose clear and bright, but at 8 o'clock it was very cloudy and looks likely to rain before noon. This morning I have been doing odd jobs around so far 12 o'clock. I thought to have gone to class this evening but dinner being I could not make it. Nothing to write about went to bed early.

July, MONDAY 11. 1892.

I thought to have done quite a great deal of writing to but I see now that I shall do none at all. I am very tired and my feet are hurting me so I shall not go to the village this evening but to bed. July, TUESDAY 12. 1892.

I expected to have received some letters today but I did not. I do not know what to think of some of my friends they seem to have forgotten me all together of late. I have nothing to write about so I shall close for today.

July, SATURDAY 15. 1892.

The weather is still very fine. I have been busy all morning. This afternoon I cleaned my room. I did intend going to the village this evening but have changed now and shall not go. The girls all went out tonight.

I have nothing to write about again today so I shall close this much, of this days doings.

July, SUNDAY 17. 1892

Weather Clear and hot. At church this morning and heard a very good sermon Rev Mr. Norton preached it not many out. After the sermon we had the lord's supper. This afternoon I went for a walk with some friends and Miss Moore. I saw my Boston friend Parker also this afternoon and was with him for some time. He is looking quite well this season. I was to have seen him again this evening but I am not going out any more. I am to see him again this day two week I we are to go cross on Roadicks Island. I hope that I shall see him see him before that time though if all goes well with us.

July, MONDAY 18. 1892.

Weather still very hot and very dry. I have read Moonstone all day long and have done but little else besides I did not get any letters today nor I did not write any either. Mrs. Jackson is coming this week to make Mrs. Jayne a little visit

July, TUESDAY 19. 1892.

Weather Clear and hot. Have been doing lots of odds and ends all day and reading Moonstone in between. I was to have gone over to see Miss Moore this evening but Moonstone held me fast and I did not leave the cottage at all. There is such a thing as a good book being more interesting than a pretty woman. However my friend would not take this as a compliment if she knew it was the book and herself that I chose between.

July, WEDNESDAY 20. 1892.

Weather the same no change at all. Mrs. Jayne is at home this morning and had 7 calls. Nothing to write about except I have been reading Moonstone off and on all day. I received a letter from R.B. Fields today and he had quite a lot to say. Mr. Bullock is out this evening and I am to wait up for him.

July, THURSDAY 21. 1892.

There is still no change in the weather. We have all been getting ready for Mrs. Jackson. She is to come this afternoon. We had dinner earlier today. I broke a decanter at dinner and I was so mortified over it that I did not know what to do. I am afraid that I have frightened Mrs. Jackson very much the way I received her in the dining room.

July, FRIDAY 22. 1892.

The weather same as yesterday. Have been reading Moonstone as usual all day long. I have more letters today Nothing to write about.

July, SATURDAY 23. 1892.

Weather the same no change I gotten through with my work in right good season today so I am going to take a bath this afternoon as I want to go to the village this evening awhile. Well I have been to the village but there was nothing of any account going on

there. I saw Millfort Leland with his best girl down on the Bay walk. I hcame home at ten and waited up for Mr. J. M. Bullock until 12 Oclock. I have at last finish Moonstone. I think it quite agood story and worth reading I have received 7 letters this week.

July, SUNDAY 24. 1892.

Weather hot dry windy and dusty. I was quite late getting up this Morning. Went to church at 10.45 mr. Winslow spoke not many out. I saw Miss Moore and walked alittle ways with her. This afternoon I went to see Mr. Allen I found him and glad to see me I think. I shall go to church again this evening if nothing. The sermon it was avery good one in many ways. I went to bed early.

July, MONDAY 25. 1892

Weather still hot and dry. I have been over-holling the lamps all today. and I thought to have done some writing in the afternoon but I did not. The truth is it is so hot one can do nothing. This is the hottest weather I have ever felt in Bar Harbor or anywhere else as I can rember. I did not write any this evening eithr. so I am getting very much behind hand with my letter writing. still I am in hopes the it will be cooler on to-morrow if so I shall have to work hard so as to get up with my writing. Mr. J. M. Bullock is out again tonight. I am waiting up for him.

July, TUESDAY 26. 1892.

I has rained just alittle this morning but is as hot now as ever again. I am not doing much today. Mr. J. M. Bullock was not home for lounch. I had thought of going to the village this afternoon but I changed my mind and shall waite and go tonight. This evening I went to call on some ladies with Mr. S. Holmes. It was very late when we called but we went in and saw the ladies for awhile. I bought some writing paper today.

July, WEDNESDAY 27. 1892.

This is the hottest day yet I think no singe of rain and it is very dusty. Mrs. Jayne has had 12 callers this morning and they made lounch very late. This afternoon I written some letters and this evening I went to the village but saw ont much as it was very late.

I had a letter from C.C. Butler. I went with Henry to Cottage Street this evening I was down on bay shore also Mr. C. H. Page was shot today in his office dead. I am very sorry for him as I have known him for along time.

July, THURSDAY 28. 1892.

The weather is much cooler this morning. I was very late getting up Mr. J.M. Bullock was up when I came to the house. After breakfast I did some washing and when lunch was over I ironed what I had washed. Mrs. Jayne was out to lunch today. Lizzie and Jessey have gone over to Bar Harbor ferry this afternoon. Mrs. Jayne and Mrs. Jackson are out driving this afternoon. I have written to Isaac Dennis a very long letter this afternoon.

Mr. J. M. Bullock is out tonight and I am to wait up for him. quite late when I gotten to bed.

July, FRIDAY 29. 1892.

It is looking like rain this morning and it is very much cooler. This is my birthday and I am quite well for an old man over forty. I am very thankful to my heavenly father for seeing this day. I hope that I am a better man today then I was this day twelve months ago. I have written three letters today. They were to the following persons. Mother, Mrs. Rathel and George Washington. I had intended going to the village this evening but was to late getting through so I went to bed early.

July, SATURDAY 30. 1892.

It has rain a little today but not enough to lay the dust. at 10 it was clear and hot again. I got through with all my work early. I taken Mr. Bullock over to the Club this morning with Toppey This afternoon I taken some notes for Mrs. Jayne. Then I taken a bath and a shave before dinner. Mr Bullock is out again tonight I am waiting up for him.

July, SUNDAY 31. 1892

The weather clear and cool quite late getting up this morning. at church at 10.45 Mr. Winslow preached a very good sermon. On my way to church I stopped for Mrs. Matthews and taken her to church with me. This afternoon I went to the post office and

from there to the boat wharf stayed for awhile then went for a walk on the bay shore. There I met Parker. he was not very well so he did not stay out long. August, SATURDAY 6. 1892.

This is another fine day. was up early and cleaned hall before breakfast then I did my Saturday's work. This afternoon I taken a bath and while I was in bath, Mr Roberts came to see me. He wants me to help him with a dinner tomorrow night which I shall do I think. This evening Mrs Jayne and Mrs. Jackson both have gone to the Kebo this evening for the first time this season. I had intended going to the village this evening but have now changed my mind and shall not go. I am not going to wait up for the folks tonight. Went to bed at 11 O'clock.

August, SUNDAY 7. 1892.

I saw Parker while in the village this afternoon and he seemed to be some what cool so I did not stay with him long. I can tell you. However I had avery goot time this afternoon altogether. I neglected counting them this morning so I cannot say just how many there was. Mrs. Jackson gave me \$2.00 and Mr. Paul \$3.00 today. They are both to leave this evening for Boston. Mr. E. Jayne was to have come this afternoon but did not. Evening, Mrs. Jackson and Mr. Paul gotten off alright. And we all went to bed quite early. When I went to the stable I talked with Henry some time before going up to bed.

August, THURSDAY 25. 1892.

Weather very much like rain. Little late getting up also breakfast late. After doing my mornings work I did some washing for myself. August, SUNDAY 28. 1892.

Weather looking like rain. up in right good season. Breakfast late. I did not get to church all day. This afternoon I went down to Roberts and had my hair cut. Mrs. Jayne is expecting The doctor this evening and have all gone to the boat to meet him and dinner is not until 8. All home Dr did not come. The girls went to church and I went to bed as soon as I was through. Mr. E. Jayne gave me 25 cts for cleaning his shoes this morning.

August, MONDAY 29. 1892.

Weather fine. up early Mr. Jayne has gone again to meet the Dr this morning, and is again disappointed. After breakfast the family all went driving I have been cleaning lamps and fixing up generally in and about the house. This afternoon I ironed some things of mine off. Had to stop and take a note for Mr. Jayne to Miss Matthews then I went and taken pillows to the boat for them. (Mr. Jayne and Miss M.) Mrs. Jayne and Mr. E. Jayne have gone for a drive. There is nothing to worth writing today.

August, TUESDAY 30. 1892.

Weather cloudy up early did not sleep well. The family are all going boating today. 10 o'clock Dr. Jayne arrived all the family out he is looking well. I have been busy all

morning. The folks were very late getting back from their boating. I have been expecting letters all week but have not as yet gotten any. I have been reading Saints rest today and like it so much that I cant help reading all the time. This evening I went for a walk. It is so tiresome to stay in the house all the evening. When I came back the family had gone to bed. So having nothing better to do I did likewise. It is looking very much like rain out tonight.

August, WEDNESDAY 31. 1892.

Weather cloudy. up rather early. This being Mrs. Jayne's reception morning I have quite a lot of fixing up to do. There was quite a number of callers. I had intended going to the village this afternoon, but having so much to do I have given it up. This evening I did not go any where or do anything so it is lost. Went to bed early. Mr. E. Jayne left for Boston tonight.

September, THURSDAY 1. 1892

This is a beautiful morning. I have been busy today doing odd things around. I have received no letters this week so far. have written but one and that was to Mother. This afternoon I went to the village to post letters and to order fish for dinner. I also went down to the boat and saw her off and on my way home I called and got my vest. I have been reading papers all evening. Mr Jayne is out I am to wait up for him. Went to bed at 12 o'clock.

September, FRIDAY 2. 1892.

This is another beautiful day. I was very late getting up this morning. After breakfast I cleaned the piazza. The family are all out. This afternoon nothing much doing so I shall now I read Saints rest. Mrs. Jayne and the Dr have gone for a walk. Mr Bullock was in to see me just now. I hope not for I want to stay here until the first of Oct if I can. This evening I had a letter from Isaac Dennis and he sent me his picture in it. I do not think it good however I am very glad to have it all the same. I have been looking for letters from Baltimore all week but so far, they have not arrived. Today is much as yesterday was so there being nothing more to do or say I think that I shall go to bed.

September, FRIDAY 16. 1892.

This is another beautiful day. I have been heling Lizzie again this morning. This afternoon I cleaned the seller. Lizzie and Hattie both are out Mrs. Mary Higgins came up this afternoon and stayed for tea. This evening I want to go down to class if nothing happens. Mr. Jayne was on time for dinner so I am going to class.

When I came back I had to wait up for Mr. Jayne. He came in at 12.

September, SATURDAY 17. 1892.

September, SUNDAY 18. 1892.

I did not go to church because I am not feeling well so, Lizzie and Hattie have both gone this morning. Mrs. Jayne wanted me to go for a drive this afternoon but I did not care to go. John, Jerome and myself beat some rugs this afternoon. This evening I went to the post office for Mrs. Jayne and one or two other places in the village. Evening, I did not go out at all tonight. The girls have gone to awake. I taken abath and while I was in the bath The girls forgot and locked me in the celler. I had to stay all night. This I did not like, but there was no help for it.

December, TUESDAY 20. 1892.

It is snowing this morning and is quite cold. Mr Brock came to see me this morning about the invitations and to let me know that he had been and ordered them elsewhere printed. Mr. Caldwell has treted us very badly. I have did nothing much today. Evening, I had aletter from mother she is well and got the money that I sent some time ago. I called at the Anderson's, than went to church. there were not many out so there was nothing much done. I went to bed early as I did nt get to bed at all last night.

December, WEDNESDAY 21. 1892.

It is beautiful and clear not so cold today. We have had the ashes taken out back this morning. After breakfast I went to market I am going to Bro Farrah's funal now.

Brother Farrah's funael was very small. I called at Anderson's. The girls are all going out this evening and I am to stay in until they get back then I am going around to church for awhile.

However I was late getting out so when I got to church every one had gone. So I went to the Anderson's again and stayed until bed time.

December, THURSDAY 22. 1892.

Beautiful and very this morning. I was out buying some things for Silver cleaning. I have cleaned silver all day. Evening, I have been to class there were not many out. My new member was out. Bro Gould. I like him very much. He seems like a very find man. After Class I went to see bro Butler and had a nice chat with him about one thing, and another.

Mr. Haseltine made me a very good offer today. He says that he will give me a pair of shoes if I will give away the ones that I am now wearing. He does not like them because they make a noise around the house. So, I shall take him at his word.

December, FRIDAY 23. 1892.

It is still very cold. I got up early this morning and made fish balls for Sarah which proved to be very good. I have been out buying some things for the house. And that is all I have done so far today. This evening I was at Church but there was no one there to meet me so I went to teacher's meeting which was at Mrs Rumford's.

December, SATURDAY 24. 1892.

I was late getting up this morning. This is a very cold day. At market spent a lot of money. Evening, I went to see Mrs. A. Butler and stayed all evening. I am very much afraid that the reception which is to be at Allen Chapel on Tuesday evening next is not going to be a success. However, we will all have to wait and see. I want to go to early church in the morning if nothing happens.

December, SUNDAY 25. 1892.

I was up at 4.30 and went to prayer meeting Mr Brock open. there was quite a good many out and a very good meeting. I have received some very nice things from Mr. Haseltine and the girls. Dr Bryant preached for us this morning. He gave us a beautiful sermon. I went down to Mrs Orrick's after church. I was to see Mrs. Burk's this afternoon and then I went to Sunday school. I also called at the Anderson's and at Bro Butlers. At the Butlers they would have me to have some dinner. At church again this evening

December, MONDAY 26. 1892.

It is still very cold today. I began today running around getting about the Brock reception and I have made all arrangements I think now so I am going to wait until the time comes. There is nothing to write about today.

December, TUESDAY 27. 1892.

This is a very cold morning. I went to Mr Brock's to get Mr J. A. Howards address. I went to Mr Howard's and he is to arrange the table for us tonight for our reception. I have been running all day and am so tired I know not what to do. Evening. The reception has passed off very nicely. We had \$85.35 to give to Mr. and Mrs. Brock after paying all expenses. There were not many out, of our own folks but quite a lot of strangers. Mr. Charles Haseltine came to see Mr. F. Haseltine this evening. I am very late going to bed.

December, WEDNESDAY 28. 1892.

Still very cold. When I went to bed last night I thought that I would have gotten up earlier than I did today. Mr. Haseltine is to have some friends to lunch at one O'clock. So I am hustling around lively. Afternoon. When I was all through I went to pay Mrs. Hermon for the cream we had last night on my way back I stop at the Andersons. This has been quite a noted day for me on the account of so many of my friends getting themselves married. Daniel A. Wilson in Richmond V.A. and Pary Coopin in Phila. And George Preston in Phila. Evening. I went to bro Butlers and spent the whole evening with him.

December, THURSDAY 29. 1892.

It is quite so cold today. After breakfast I went down Street before I begin the cleaning of my silver and while out I called at Mrs. A. Butlers. Work has gone pretty hard with me today. Evening, at class there were not many out. After class I went home with Danwood for awhile. I am late going to bed tonight.

December, FRIDAY 30. 1892.

I got up very early this morning and swept the dining room. And after breakfast washed windows cleaned closets I worked until it was quite late. I don't think now that I am going to get as much done this week as I set out to do on Monday. Evening, I was at the Andersons before going to church, to teachers meeting. Everything past off nicely in the election of Offeres for the chool. I went to bed early.

December, SATURDAY 31. 1892.

Well this is the last day's writing in this diary. I have been trying to do lots of things today but have rally did nothing much. It is not so cold today- I was at Wanamakers , and bough adiairy for 93. Afternoon. I taken abath and shall not go out anywhere until I go to watch meeting tonight. Miss Bent is coming to dinner. I had aletter from Isaac Dennis and he is now at his mother's. I have attended watch meeting and afterwords went home with bro Butler and stayed the rest of the night. I paid Dr. Coopin \$20.00 that I was owing him.
